

Staying Away From the Enemy

S.A.F.E will train educators how to identify students K-12 grades, college and university levels who may be in homes experiencing or affected by sexual and domestic abuse.

Facts: In United States there are thirty-two known sexually transmitted diseases. One in two girls are sexually abused before 18 and one in four boys. According to UNC, at Chapel Hill the highest of those infected are students 15-19. Black females are at the highest risk for HIV, CDC, 2002.

Principles: S.A.F.E. was developed for equipping young men and women ages 12-21 wholesome principles that will enable them to live healthy and safe lives.

- S. Soundness of mind, putting self-first no sex until marriage
- A. Attitude, respect for authority
- F. Freedom (don't take it for granted)
 Friendship (a covenant word)
- E. Enemy anything that deters destiny and personal goals excellence (exemplify it in your character)

The conference brought laity and leadership together from around the country; civic organizations, and non profits alike.
